ENTSOG commences the project collection for the Ten-Year Network Development Plan 2020 on 30 May 2019

(Brussels, 13 May 2019, PR0183-19) **On 30 May 2019, ENTSOG will commence the project collection process for the Ten-Year Network Development Plan 2020 (TYNDP 2020), in line with Regulation (EU) 347/2013, Annex III.2 (4). This also represents the first step for the 5th selection by European Commission of Projects of Common Interest (PCI).**

Project promoters should submit their projects for TYNDP 2020 during the ‘Project Submission Phase’ between **30 May and 28 June 2019**. Project promoters who have already submitted their projects for TYNDP 2018 are required to re-submit their projects and provide up-to-date data to allow their projects to be considered. It is possible to submit projects during this time period only. Submission will be via an [online questionnaire](#) and access credentials can be checked in advance of the 30 May commencement date.

Jan Ingwersen, ENTSOG General Manager said: *“With this edition of the TYNDP, ENTSOG takes a step forward and opens TYNDP 2020 for submission of energy transition projects, to facilitate the integration of renewables and the achievement of decarbonisation targets.”*

All submitted projects will need to comply with specific administrative and technical criteria for their inclusion in TYNDP, as defined in the “ENTSOG Practical implementation document (PID) for developing the TYNDP 2020”, available [here](#).
